

Baseball Frame

Father's day is a great time to show the dad in your life how much you care. And what better way than with a fun arts and craft for fathers day project! The two of you will have a blast working together on these easy arts and crafts for father's day, and will have a keepsake to remember your day by. Have fun!



Materials Needed:

- Picture frame
- Baseball themed wooden stickers
- Photo

Method:

- Insert photo into frame
- Use wooden stickers to decorate outside of frame (available at craft stores)

Hug Box

Materials Needed:

- Small Box
- Tissue Paper
- Glue
- Paper

Method:

- Cut many approximately 2 inch x 2 inch squares from the tissue paper.
- Cut out plenty because you will be covering the whole box!
- Water down the glue - 2 parts glue to 1 part water.
- Lightly brush some glue on the box and stick on the tissue paper squares you cut out.

- You want them to overlap so you do not see the box.
- Work in small sections until the entire box is covered.
- Set aside to dry.
- Once it is dry, you can lightly brush over your box with the glue and water mixture to make it more durable and shiny; however this is optional.
- Once dry, tie with curly ribbon as you would a wrapped present and attached a gift tag which reads...

This is a very special gift
 That you can never see
 The reason it's so special is
 It's just for you from me.
 Whenever you are lonely
 Or are ever feeling blue
 You only have to hold this gift
 And know I'm hugging you.
 You never can unwrap it
 Please leave the ribbon tied
 Just hold the box close to your heart
 It's filled with hugs inside.

Dad Key chain

Materials Needed:

- Alphabet beads
- 4 football beads
- Hemp or jewelry cord, about 12 inches round key chain

Method:

- Begin by tying a double or triple knot at one end of the jewelry cord to keep beads from falling off.
- Alphabet letters often come with additional beads with hearts.
- Begin stringing on the beads starting with a heart, then a football, then the word "ever" starting with the "r" first. Next string on another football, then the word "dad", another football, next the word "best", and lastly the fourth football.
- Tie a knot after the last football, as close to the football as you can to keep the beads close together.

- Double the knot.
- Next, tie the long end (closest to the word "best") of the jewelry cord to the key chain.
- Knot this several times to ensure security, then trim off the excess cord.
