

New Words – Flash Cards

Print on cardstock and laminate for protection. Each lesson has New Words within it. Your child should be relatively comfortable with the pronunciation and definition of each word, as well as the spelling.

Lesson ideas

Within each lesson:

- Ask your child to form sentences with the words. Select a card and ask your child to write a sentence using that word.
- Select words from within each lesson during that particular lesson. Ask your child to tell you what he or she thinks the definition is. Dictionary work may again be necessary. If he or she is able, your child can write the answer or you can write on his or her behalf. You may be comfortable with simple discussion.

When your child is relatively familiar with these words you may want to consider a short memory or "revision" test, selecting words that you will ask your child to write (spelling) and define (definition). You may wish to use the cards as "sight cards" where your child can glimpse the card before writing down his or her answer.

You may of course wish to make use of the cards in other ways. This is depending on the age of the child. Where possible (in terms of the meaning of the words) and for an entire lesson plan, you may wish to select a number of nouns from within the word cards. Show the card to your child and ask him or her to draw a picture depicting what he or she thinks that word would look like in picture form.
